Programs Committee: Help WOW Combat Hunger During the COVID-19 Crisis

Not surprisingly, restrictions on daily life due to COVID-19 disproportionately affect the poorest and most disadvantaged members of our community. With massive layoffs from the closures of schools, restaurants, and numerous businesses across the area, many of our neighbors are struggling to meet the basic requirements for food. Even before the COVID-19 crisis, *one in six North Texans was food insecure* and didn't know where their next meal would come from. The "COVID-19 Relief Bill" just passed by Congress provides comprehensive support for displaced workers, but even those eligible for unemployment compensation will experience significant delays before receiving financial help.

Through the North Texas Food Bank (NTFB), WOW Dems created a fundraising site to help fight hunger: <u>wowdems.causevox.com</u>. NTFB is a nonprofit hunger relief organization headquartered in Plano that distributes nutritious food across a 13-county area using a network of partner agencies.

We are pleased to announce that an anonymous WOW Dems donor contributed \$1,000! Though we may never learn who that donor was, please know how deeply we appreciate your generosity, thoughtfulness, and selfless caring for others.

Every dollar donated to NTFB provides three meals. Only a few can donate \$1,000 or more, but if 40 people donate \$25 each (or if 100 donate \$10 each), we can have the same positive impact on the health and well-being of our North Texas neighbors who need this help during this difficult time.

Legislative Committee: Primaries, COVID, Redistricting, and More

In the March 3 Texas primary, Democratic turnout was higher and Republican turnout lower than in 2016. Here in North Texas, Collin and Denton Counties saw a record-breaking number of Democratic voters in the primary, likely due to rapid population growth and increased diversity. This may mean momentum is on our side, but Texas Republicans still don't feel threatened by the Dem surge and believe Trump will be re-elected in November.

WE NEED TO GET OUT THE VOTE! REGISTER AT VOTETEXAS.GOV.

About 16.2 million Texans are currently registered to vote. We must register everyone we can and continue to engage non-voters and get them to show up at the polls in November. However, COVID-19 precautions may pose unique challenges to this year's elections. Contact Gov. Abbott (gov.texas.gov/contact) and demand vote by mail!

The Texas runoff election is scheduled for May 26, with early voting slated for May 18-22. Democratic runoffs will be for the U.S. Senate, U.S. CD 3, TX HD 67, and Texas Railroad Commissioner. Note: These dates may change due to concerns over COVID-19. The deadline to register to vote in the runoff is April 2. Visit VoteTexas.gov to register!

Census questionnaires should have arrived in your mail a couple weeks ago. Once you receive the information (which will have a Census ID number on it) you can fill out the questionnaire at www.census.gov. Keep an eye on our WOW Legislative Committee reports to find out how YOU can encourage others to complete the census questionnaire.

Keep an eye on our upcoming newsletters and social media for info on this year's **redistricting**, which is being handled by a committee chaired by Rep. Phil King. Redistricting happens only once every 10 years, so be on the lookout for calls to action about contacting the redistricting committee regarding a fair process. Public hearings regarding redistricting were cancelled in March and the one public hearing scheduled for early April has been cancelled as well, but visit redistricting.capitol.texas.gov to keep up with the process and any public hearing notices.

COVID-19 headlines are coming fast and furious. America now leads the world in the

number of confirmed cases, and everyone's been affected by this pandemic in some way. Coronavirus relief bills were signed into law during the last few weeks, but whether the aid intended in those packages will be enough for Americans struggling through this crisis remains to be seen. Further, the president has voiced a desire to ease restrictions aimed at protecting public health, like social distancing, by Easter, which could mean a rise in the number of coronavirus cases AND could set a dangerous precedent for local lawmakers seeking to do the same in their cities or counties. In fact, the McKinney mayor has just recently gone head to head with conservative Collin County Judge Chris Hill regarding the former's desire to maintain shelter-in-place mandates, which Hill seeks to override in the interest of the local economy. Contact the president (whitehouse.gov/contact) and Judge Hill (chill@collincountytx.gov) and remind them they are responsible for the public health. Therefore, shelter-in-place mandates must stay in place until we are clear of this danger!
